## MODUS PRESS RELEASE

Modus Structures Inc. will be building high performance modular classrooms for Alberta students for the next two years, after having been awarded a multi-year supply contract up to 2014.

The award provides for the production and supply of up to 300 classrooms for Alberta Infrastructure and Alberta Education. The program is designed to accommodate enrolment growth and fluctuation as Alberta students migrate from one area of a school jurisdiction to another, or between jurisdictions.

The classrooms will be constructed using Modus' proprietary structural insulated panel (SIP) construction technology and will be built in Modus' Crossfield, Alberta plants. According to Randy Ludwar, Modus CEO, Modus' cutting-edge structures offer the optimal learning environment for Alberta's students, far outperforming traditional "portables," and fulfill the Alberta government's mandate for structures with low impact on Alberta's environment.

"We are pleased to be a part of the province's legacy of infrastructure that is sustainable, environmentally-friendly and safe for its children," Modus CEO Randy Ludwar said. "We applaud the Government's on-going commitment to green construction technologies."

The initial construction and supply agreement involves the construction of 40 classrooms scheduled for completion and deployment by June 2012.

Modus has successfully completed a number of projects for provincial governments in response to an increased demand for flexible classroom solutions that prioritize student health and safety. Since its first production, the Government of Alberta has awarded Modus structures "preferred supplier" status. To date, Modus has produced over 1,000 classrooms and daycare units in Alberta and Saskatchewan.
